*We found this grape to be perfect for the soil, sun and place—Dry Creek Valley. It captures the grassy and the tropical fruit notes. Like a duet, it balances the essence of Sauvignon Blanc, bright and captivating.*

*The first wines we made were blends of estate fruit, they truly reflected the personality of our vineyards. Classico hearkens back to that time and is a distinctively classic wine for this time.*

*The Pedroncelli house is founded on Zinfandel. Estate vineyards, from 10 to 110 years old, are the foundation along with Petite Sirah. Made in a bold style of berry and spice.*

*Pedroncelli was the first to plant Cabernet Sauvignon in Dry Creek Valley. It is a blend of brethren estate grown Bordeaux varieties and features layers of striking flavors and great character.*
